- **Morse to Microchip: How the Royal Signals' Vision 2033 Leverages a Legacy of Agility, Credibility and Innovation.**
- Published in 2023, the Vision aims to enhance operational effectiveness by prioritising agility and innovation in delivering critical communication and information services across the full spectrum of military operations. It seeks to solidify the Corps' status as a credible global leader in military communications, ensuring advanced technology integration and readiness for future conflicts.
- Through personal audio testimonies from four operational theatres, spanning 1944 to 2021, Ryan Ellis will demonstrate how credibility and agility are deeply rooted in the Corps' history and ethos. These firsthand accounts, taken from the Royal Signals Museum oral history library, will illustrate the technical expertise and innovation that define the Corps, while showcasing how adaptability and teamwork have maintained its edge in an ever-evolving battlefield.

- Ryan Ellis is the Head of Storytelling at the Royal Signals Museum, tasked with capturing the Cold War and contemporary history of the Royal Corps of Signals. His oral history interviews span the end of the Second World War, including the daring exploits of the Special Operations Executive, to the 2021 Afghanistan evacuation.
- He specialises in digital storytelling, launching curated audio and visual content on the free and globally accessible Bloomberg Connects app. In 2024, in recognition of his work, he featured on the inaugural BBC History Magazine '30 under 30' list.
- Beyond the Museum, Ryan is a Director of the national Cold War Network and sits on the Youth Advisory Board of the National Museum of the Royal Navy. In this role, he advises Trustees on accessibility and digital engagement.
